Removal Goods : All citizens, moving to Greece from a non-EEC country	<p>EEC citizens having lived abroad for more than 2 years, must obtain a "certificate of permanent residence" from the nearest Greek Consulate accompanied by a detailed inventory. After arrival, they must also obtain a 5-year residence permit.</p> <p>Non-EEC citizens must obtain a "certificate of secondary residence" from the nearest Greek Consulate.</p> <p>They must also provide a bank guarantee, and a copy of their house lease or purchase contract.</p>	<p>Duty free entry.</p> <p>Liable for VAT only.</p>	
Removal goods : Permanent foreign residents coming to work for a Greek company, under the Greek emergency law 89/67	They must produce work and residence permits, and their company's confirmation of their employment.	Entitled to temporary duty-free importation.	Once their work contract is terminated, the goods must be re-exported.
